

# Veterans Memorial Park Display Policies

## “Veteran Honor Bricks”

1. There will be multiple dedicated pentagon pillars that will display laser etched glass bricks that are only 4” x 8” in size. Each brick is limited to one individual name and the related service information of that veteran who is currently serving or has honorably served in any branch of the military. These pillars will be clearly marked as “Military Honor Pillar”. The memorial bricks are NOT limited to Blanchard residents but are available to any veteran.
2. Each brick can only display up to three lines of text. Each brick is limited to 18 characters per line. A character is defined as a letter, character, space, etc.
3. These bricks will be sold individually for \$125.00 each. If an individual purchases three (3) or more bricks at the same time, they are eligible for the discounted price of \$100.00 each. Follow-up purchases will follow the same guidelines as listed here.
4. If requested, the committee can make sure that a grouping of family members will be displayed together when the pillars are constructed.
5. Examples of information to display on Line 2 & Line 3 of the honor bricks are:

Branch of Service:	<b>US Army</b>	Conflict:	<b>Vietnam</b>
Rank:	<b>LtCol</b>	Notes:	<b>POW</b>
Years of Service:	<b>1941-1945</b>	Awards:	<b>Silver Star</b>

## “Sponsorship Panels”

1. One pentagon pillar will be exclusively dedicated for all corporate, business and individual sponsors of the memorial. This pillar will display up to fourteen (14) different sizes and configurations of sponsorship panels. The pillar will be clearly marked “Memorial Sponsorship Pillar”. The available sizes and prices of sponsorship are as follows:

16” x 20” - \$5,000.00	20” x 12” - \$3,750.00	20” x 8” - \$2,500.00
12” x 20” - \$3,750.00	16” x 12” - \$3,000.00	16” x 8” - \$2,000.00
8” x 20” - \$2,500.00	12” x 12” - \$2,250.00	12” x 8” - \$1,500.00
4” x 20” - \$1,250.00	8” x 12” - \$1,500.00	8” x 8” - \$1,000.00
	4” x 12” - \$750.00	4” x 8” - \$500.00

2. Corporate, business and organization panels may include any information, text, graphic, logo, photo, etc, that promotes the sponsor.
3. Individuals may also purchase a sponsor panel to support the memorial construction. The panel content may reflect the donor's name, along with an appropriate logo, flag or insignia. It may also include a word such as proud "Patriot", "Sponsor", "Supporter", "Citizen", "American", etc.
4. The words "in memory of" or "in honor of" may NOT be used in the content engraved for any sponsor brick or panel.
5. Also a brick or panel may be purchased to recognize a civilian for DOD service or community service. Such sponsorship panel may include the individual's name, along with their related service or volunteer information. A 4" x 8" sponsor panel must adhere to the same limitation of content as an Honor Brick referenced above. If the sponsor panel is large enough, it may also include the family member name(s) or business that sponsored the recognition.
6. If a sponsor panel is purchased for a military veteran, that purchaser may also obtain a 4" x 8" Veteran's Honor Brick, in a Military Honor Pillar, for the same individual, for only \$50.00. If the sponsor panel is 16" x 20" in size, the same individuals 4" x 8" Honor Brick shall be complimentary.
7. The Blanchard Veteran's Memorial Committee reserves the right to validate, approve or reject any information, diagrams or text submitted for engraving on any brick or panel.

### **"Bronze Donor Panel"**

1. In order to individually acknowledge donations received between \$250.00 and \$500.00, there will be recognized on a "Bronze Donor Panel" located in the "Memorial Sponsorship Pillar". This will allow for recognition of each person or business making such a donation, by listing their name or business on that panel.
2. All other unassigned donations will be accepted as anonymous and will not be itemized or listed in the "Memorial Sponsorship Pillar".
